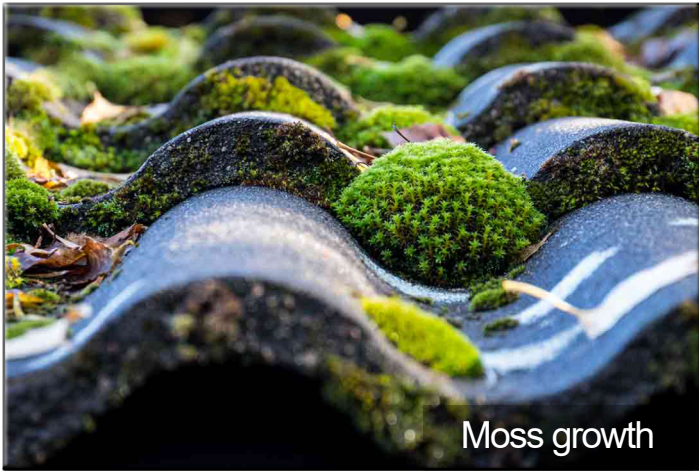
Why protect your roof tiles?



Moss, Algae and Lichen tend to grow on roof tiles and they can cause damage to your roof both directly, and indirectly.

Large patches of moss on your roof will hold water against the surface leading to potential rot.

Holding water on your roof also massively increases the chances of freeze thaw damage when the weather turns cold and ripping your tiles apart.



Algae, and in turn Lichen, also grow on your roof due to the perfect combination of water, light and fresh air flow. While less damaging than moss the roof itself, it is extremely unsightly and can permanently stain the surface of your tiles



What protection can Sentinel offer?



Specifically developed to seal and protect roof tiles, Sentinel will seal off your roof tiles and directly protect them from water ingress.

Furthermore, the active Silver Ion Technology in the coating will create an antimicrobial barrier that ensure nothing can grown on the surface, resulting in no growth of moss, lichen or algae.



The result is a hydrophobic, antimicrobial barrier between the rain, water, microbes and dirt, and your roof tiles. Leaving them protected for upwards of 10 years from the damage that results from growth



Note how the coated section of the tiles repel the water while the water absorbs in to the un-coated areas

How do the tiles look after they are coated



While Sentinel is does it's best to go undetected on the surface, any coating will slightly change the characteristic of the tiles. As such, we offer two finishes: Gloss or Satin.



The gloss finish adds an increased sheen to your roof and we have found that customers really enjoy the way it makes their roofs stand out from their neighbours; creating a premium image

The Satin finish is designed to be as close to the original finish as possible. While you can see the difference from coated and uncoated next to each other, when on the roof you would not notice that tiles had been coated with Sentinel Satin.

In the real world setting it is hard to tell where is coated, and where isn't.



Step by step



1. Clean the surface with your choice of roof cleaner to remove all growth. For newer tiles we offer our SENTINEL Roof Cleaner.

2. Rinse off the area with fresh water to remove all of the cleaning solution

3. Allow the surface to air dry. Inspect and repeat 1-2 if needed

4. When dry, apply the SENTINEL Roof Sealer using either a brush, roller or foam pad. Be sure to get the coating into the gaps between the tiles where growth tends to start



5. The coating will look white on the surface - this is normal but it will cure clear. Leave to cure for 3-4 hours

6. Once cured, the surface will be sealed and protected from future growth.

The end result is a beautiful clean roof that will remain looking that way for years to come. No more moss blowing down into your gutter and garden.
